
Property backs on to TV Valley Parks & Recreation land & Willow Creek.

The Willow Creek Greenway trail starts on NW 173rd Avenue between Autumn Ridge Drive and NW 170th Drive and comes out at NW Waterhouse Avenue.

Willow Creek Greenway, a 17-acre natural area in Beaverton's Five Oaks/Triple Creek neighborhood, surrounds Willow Creek as it meanders (to the south and west) toward Beaverton Creek.

The greenway is accessible via [Waterhouse Park](#), along the [Waterhouse Trail](#) powerline corridor, from adjacent [Moshofsky Woods](#) and from neighborhood entrances at NW Silverado Dr., NW 161st Pl., and NW Waterhouse Ave.

Some of the two-thirds mile trail passing through the greenway is paved, but a great length of it is a boardwalk that runs along the creek. Willow Creek Greenway is a habitat restoration site, where Natural Resources staff removes invasive species to plant native species, making the site a great place to spot native birds and wildlife.

Moshofsky Woods Natural Area



Moshofsky Woods Natural Area is a three-acre wooded natural area along Willow Creek in Beaverton's Five Oaks/Triple Creek neighborhood.

A highlight of Moshofsky Woods Natural Area is a long wooden boardwalk. The Willow Creek riparian corridor is a great destination for bird and wildlife watching opportunities, and is accessible from the [Waterhouse Trail](#), the north-south regional trail in the north section of the park district.

Neighborhood access to the natural area is provided at NW Winged Foot Terr.
